### **UKULELE LEARNING TIPS**

- If you are having trouble fretting (fingering) a chord, you can just not strum (or pick) one of the notes (strings), and just strum or pick the other three. This works best when it is an outside string (first or last string).
- If necessary, find your own way (fingering, etc.) to play a chord. How someone else plays it won't work for everyone.
- Give yourself credit when you learn something, and don't compare yourself to others who are "better." Just realize that you are better than you used to be.
- Have fun, and enjoy the music that you are making.
